Olympia:

• <u>Route 41 to Evergreen</u>: Trips run on college class days from September 26, 2016 through June 9, 2017. The 15 minute trips do not operate on the following days due to holidays, quarter breaks, or evaluation weeks. See Transit Guide for specific dates (page 35).

Express Service

Tacoma:

- <u>Northbound trips serving the Tacoma Dome</u> <u>Station (Routes 603, 612, & 605)</u>: The stop at the Tacoma Dome Station will be relocated from its current location, Zone A, to a new location on G Street/"Zone G." Pierce Transit estimates this new stop will be completed by the end of September. Intercity Transit buses will begin using it when it becomes available. Until then, Express trips will continue to use Zone A.
- <u>Southbound trips from Tacoma</u>: Due to on-going I-5 re-construction around the Pacific Ave/ SR 16 interchange, all trips going to Thurston County/Olympia will now serve the Tacoma Dome Station on Puyallup Avenue. The stop at Pacific Ave/25th St. (Jack in the Box) will no longer be served.
