Bus Stop Enhancements Coming this Fall



Intercity Transit is improving 47 bus stops to provide easier access to both the front and back doors of buses. These accessibility improvements will expand landing pads in support of our long-range

plan and "zero-fare" demonstration project that eliminated collection of bus fares. Construction began Sept. 1 and will continue throughout fall 2021.

During stop closures riders will be asked to use a nearby alternate stop, or a temporary stop next to the construction.

Each week we'll send out rider alerts and post notices on affected bus stops, including where riders can get on and off the bus.

Improvements Coming to the Olympia Transit Center



Beginning Oct. 4, we will begin construction of site improvements in the southwest corner of the Olympia Transit Center (OTC) site, adjacent to State Ave. and Washington St.

Site Improvements Include:

- New sidewalks and ADA ramps along State Ave. and Washington St.
- New pathways to improve pedestrian flow onsite and crossing to the main bus platform.
- Updated landscaping.
- Updated lighting, benches and amenities.

Construction is anticipated to be completed mid-December of 2021.

What to Expect During Construction:

Typical construction hours are weekdays from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Pedestrians and riders can expect sidewalk closures on State Ave. (between Franklin St. and Washington St.) and on Washington St. (from State Ave. to mid-block on Washington St.).

October 2021

The bus stop on State Ave. (The One) will be relocated to Olympia Ave. during construction.

Bay L, which has connections to Mason Transit, Grays Harbor Transit and Twin Transit, will be temporarily relocated to Olympia Ave.

Riders who access services at the OTC should be aware of the potential for temporary closures and pedestrian detours, pay attention to posted notices, and plan additional time to reach their bus stop. Construction is not anticipated to impact bus arrivals and transfers on the main bus platform at the OTC.
