Face Masks Optional on all Vehicles and Inside Transit Buildings



The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) ended the federal mask mandate on April 18, 2022.

Wearing a face mask at transit facilities and on transit vehicles is now optional. However, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) continues to recommend that people wear masks in indoor public transportation settings.

Face masks will be provided on board for passengers who don't have one but want to continue wearing one while riding.

- Passengers bullying those who choose to continue wearing masks, or those who choose not to, will not be tolerated.
- We will continue to provide hand sanitizer on board.
- We will continue our enhanced cleaning protocols.
- Board buses using the rear door, unless you need the ramp, kneeler, or have a child in a stroller. If you need to enter at the front of the bus, please wait at the front door and tell the driver.
- Have a destination when you board and disembark when you get there. Continuous riding is not allowed.
- If you are connecting to a neighboring transit agency, please check their masking requirements before boarding.

We appreciate everyone's patience and cooperation over the last two years.

Please be patient as we remove signage for our facilities and buildings. We continue to monitor any potential updates to federal masking requirements, which are subject to change. For the most up-to-date information, visit <u>intercitytransit.com</u>.

Bike Lockers now Open at the Olympia Transit Center



Intercity Transit opened day-use bicycle lockers at the Olympia Transit Center this month. We hope passengers will use them as they're

making active transportation choices to get around the community. Here are a few things to keep in mind when using them:

- 1. The lockers are located south of the main covered bus terminal.
- Lockers will be available from 5 a.m. to 11 p.m., daily for storing bikes and bicycle equipment only.
- 3. All items will be removed and discarded nightly after 11 p.m.

4. The lockers are under 24-hour live and recorded video surveillance.
