Martin Way Park & Ride Improvements



Intercity Transit's contractor has begun work to improve safety and speed up service at the Martin Way Park & Ride. Improvements will

include bus-only direct access from the northbound I-5 on-ramp into the park and ride, a new bus stop adjacent to the on-ramp, and related facility updates. You'll see construction activity at the park and ride through the fall of 2023.

Construction is anticipated to temporarily impact some parking areas and will require temporary relocation of the bus loading area. When finished, the project will reduce travel times and improve bus access and passenger loading areas for riders who use Olympia Express service connecting Olympia/Lacey to regional bus and commuter rail services in Lakewood/Pierce County.

Watch for changes posted at the park and ride and subscribe to updates to stay informed on when and how the changes may impact parking and boarding locations until the project is complete. Bus Stop Enhancements Wrap-Up

In October 2022, our contractor began working to improve bus stops throughout our system to provide easier access for front and rear door boarding. This work included accessibility improvements to expand landing pads in support of our long-range plan and zero-fare demonstration project that eliminated the collection of bus fares to speed up boarding among other things.

The contractor is close to finishing bus stop enhancements at 123 bus stops. We anticipate this project will be complete by the end of this month.

While we are excited to see these improvements complete, we're already planning for the next phase of bus stop enhancements, which will begin in late 2023 or early 2024. Enhanced Routes Pages Coming Soon



In September 2021, Intercity Transit launched the current version of its website. That redesign focused on making high priority improvements like improving the navigation and adding the trip

planner and top tasks to the homepage. We also made significant changes to our routes pages. But we knew the work wouldn't stop there.

Roughly 60 percent of visits to our website are to help users plan trips. Of those, about 65 percent are to view schedules for one of our routes. When we thought about the next round of website upgrades, it was clear the biggest impact for our users would be to improve the usability and accessibility of our routes pages.

The revised route pages will have a cleaner look, allow users to customize how schedules and stops are displayed, and provide real-time route information.
