Service Changes Effective June 11, 2023

ZERO-FARE Our June 11, 2023 service change JUST GET ON AND GO! continues much of the

service already being provided with the exceptions of Routes 62A, 62B and 66. These routes will begin their inbound trips earlier to keep buses on schedule and allow more time for transfers at the Lacey Transit Center.

Service Details

Route 62A

- Morning inbound trips will begin three minutes earlier.
- Afternoon Inbound trips will begin one minute earlier.

• Evening Inbound trips will begin two minutes earlier.

Route 62B

- Morning inbound trips will begin two minutes later.
- Afternoon Inbound trips will begin one minute earlier.
- Evening Inbound trips will begin three minutes later.

Route 66

Inbound trips will leave two minutes earlier.

Upcoming Changes

When construction at the Martin Way Park and Ride is complete, Route 620 will be adjusted slightly at the facility to incorporate the new bus stop that will be adjacent to the on-ramp. This change is expected in late-June or July. Schedules for Route 620 will not change.

Practice Bike Safety at Mountain View Elementary's Traffic Garden



A traffic garden is a safe and fun place for youth to learn and practice bicycle and pedestrian safety skills in an environment away from vehicles. The streetscape

includes bike lanes, stop lines, crosswalks, and roundabouts to help children grow confidence and become safe bicyclists.

The traffic garden is on Mountain View Elementary School's playground at 1900 College Street SE in Lacey.

The traffic garden provides an outdoor classroom for the school's physical education program and is open to the community during non-school hours. The project is a partnership between Child Care Action Council's Safe Kids Thurston County, Intercity Transit's Walk N Roll program, North Thurston Public Schools, and Alliance for a Healthier Generation with funding from State Farm.
