The Intercity Transit Authority (ITA) is seeking civically-minded individuals to serve on the ITA or on the Community Advisory Committee (CAC).

Join the ITA and be part of a nine-member Board of Directors that sets policy and direction for the transit agency. You'll be one of three citizen representatives who will serve a three-year term. You must live within the public transportation benefit area to apply.

The CAC is a 20-member advisory group that provides input to the ITA on local public transportation issues. As a member of the CAC you'll serve a three-year term and represent a crosssection of the community. You must live within the public transportation benefit area to apply.

This service is a four year grantfunded demonstration project and is separate from the Bus Rapid Transit Light service outlined in Intercity Transit's Long-Range Plan. Bus Rapid Transit Light isn't scheduled to be implemented until

2026.

Bus Riding 101: Travel Training Tips



Be prepared when riding the bus! Take a few minutes to check the weather and gear up accordingly. As the days get shorter, be sure to wear reflective clothing so you can be seen in the early morning and late

evening hours.

"Be Safe. Be Seen." this Season

With daylight savings time ending next month, many of us travel when it's dark outside. Our drivers make extra efforts to watch for riders waiting at unlit bus stops, but we need your help!

To ensure you're noticed this season, "Be Safe. Be Seen.", pick up a free reflective light at Customer Service at the Olympia Transit Center or on buses, while supplies last.

Here are some tips for safe travel this winter:

 Wear bright-colored or reflective clothing. Drivers can see you 500 feet away when you wear reflective clothing compared to just 55 feet when wearing dark colors.



- Add some shine. Put relfectors on your shoes, backpack, purse, bicycle spokes, jacket sleeves, or pant legs. As long as the driver can see the reflector it'll be helpful!
- Light yourself up. Pick up an Intercity Transit

reflective light, carry flashlight, flashing safety strobe, or use your cell phone. Help drivers see you



by standing up, moving or waving as the bus approaches your stop.

Remember these tips when you're riding the bus or visit intercitytransit.com/besafe so you are sure to "Be Safe, Be Seen," this season.
