Public Invited to Comment on Proposed September 2020 Service Changes



Intercity Transit seeks rider and public comment on its proposed September 2020 service changes for possible implementation on September 20, 2020. If we are able to, a public hearing will be held on Wednesday, June 3, 2020 5:30 p.m. at our business office, 526 Pattison St. SE in Olympia. We will follow the public meetings guidance of "Safe Start Washington: A Phased Approach to Recovery." If an in-person meeting is not allowed, other opportunities to provide public comment will be available.

Details about providing public comment via phone or other electronic means will be posted at <u>intercitytransit.com</u>. If you need special accommodations to participate, call 360-705-5860 three days prior to the meeting.

The proposed changes to bus service include:

- **Route 42:** Realign Route 42 from the South Puget Sound Community College (SPSCC) Olympia campus' interior (Crosby Loop) to the campus' northern edge (Mottman Rd) as part of the transit agency's overall system updates to improve route safety and efficiency. New stops will be added on the south and north side of Mottman Road for campus access. Bus frequency will be improved to 22 or 23 minutes.
- **Routes 62A/62B:** Extra running time added to outbound and inbound evening trips leaving Olympia Transit Center between 5:45 and 8 p.m.
- Routes 45, 60, 67, and Dash: Minor schedule changes to improve schedule reliability.
